MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL CONVENTION OF THE FÉDÉRATION
INTERPROFESSIONNELLE DE LA SANTÉ DU QUÉBEC HELD ON MARCH 21,
2017 AT THE LAVAL SHERATON HOTEL

TUESDAY, MARCH 21, 2017

After having confirmed the quorum, Régine Laurent, President of the Federation, accompanied by Line Larocque, 1st Vice-President, Political Officer for the Status of Women and Sociopolitical Sectors and Joint Political Officer for the Union Organizing Service, Daniel Gilbert, 2nd Vice-President, Joint Political Officer for the Negotiation, Labour Relations and Research Sectors, Nancy Bédard, 4th Vice-President, Joint Political Officer for the Task and Organization of Work Sector and Joint Political Officer for the Negotiation Sector, Linda Bouchard, 5th Vice-President, Joint Political Officer for the Labour Relations and Research Sector, Michel Mailhot, 6th Vice-President, Political Officer for the Social Security, Occupational Health and Safety Sectors, the Legal Team and Joint Political Officer for the Union Organizing Service, Marie-Claude Ouellet, Secretary, Political Officer for the Organization and follow-up of meetings, the action plan and the priority actions, Translation, the Youth Committee and the General Secretariat and Roberto Bomba, Treasurer, Political Officer for the treasury, the Union Defence Fund (FDS), Solidarity, the Information Technology-Documentation Service, Human Resources and Administration Services and Joint Political Officer for the Union Organizing Service. She pointed out the absence of Claude Boucher, 3rd Vice-President, Political Officer for the Education-Animation Service and Joint Political Officer for the Union Organizing Service and then opened the Special Convention at 10:03 am.

First, Ms. Laurent reported that she would have liked to announce good news; that the FIQ now represents all the healthcare professionals in Laval, Gaspésie and North Shore. Unfortunately, this is not the case, these regions having chosen another labour organization to represent them. Everyone knew that it was not a foregone conclusion for the regions of Laval and Gaspésie, although the reception was very good and the union representatives and consultants worked hard so that enthusiasm was in order. Consequently, many believed in it, wanted it, and prepared for it. As for the North Shore, nothing can be taken for granted, but we are still optimistic despite everything. Furthermore, the union reps and the consultants have also done an exceptional job there.

These results are a slap in the face for the FIQ in a way. However, Ms. Laurent refused to be dramatic about the facts because the organization has won impressive victories in Abitibi, the Laurentians, the Lanaudière, Montérégie-Est, the Eastern Townships, Saguenay-Lac-Saint-Jean and today in Montérégie-Ouest. She took this opportunity to thank all those who have participated and contributed to these positive results.

She mentioned that the organization has to confront reality, as trying to avoid it and minimize it would be simply dishonest. Therefore, it is preferable to set the record straight as it always does even when the news is not great. In this respect, the members of the Executive Committee of the FIQ, nevertheless refuse to be pessimistic, instead wanting to be realistic and clear-headed in order to properly understand, as they have a duty to tell the truth.

According to Ms. Laurent, it is too early to do a complete analysis of the situation, at the same time insisting that this will be done quickly and frankly because the organization has to understand. Understand what didn't work and hear what might not necessarily please us, quoting some questions as examples:

"Did we listen to the healthcare professionals enough to learn what is good for them? Are there generational differences? Did we move too fast in the proposed changes? To what point did our demands change the daily lives of our healthcare professionals? Are we paying the price for their exasperations faced with the upheavals of the Barrette-Couillard duo? Lastly, is the FIQ's message reaching the members?"

All these questions require a reflection. Everything is not completed and there is still a lot to do. However, she feels it is important to point out all the work done by all the union representatives over the last few months and she asked them to deviate from the functioning of the meeting and give them a round of applause!

Ms. Laurent could not ignore the fact that the Barrette reform imposed as proven to be a failure. In fact, services have been affected, working conditions are deteriorating and the minister simply smiles while pointing out that the FIQ makes the healthcare network sound worse than it is while the media are only reporting stories. However, the reality reveals that the patients are suffering because of this reform, compulsory overtime still exists whereas other healthcare professionals have trouble putting in a full week while the employers are burying their heads in the sand.

The new FIQ which has to be embedded in the constitution and bylaws will not be exactly the one that wasn't planned. However, it will be big, strong and, above all, be in our image, Ms. Laurent concluded with conviction. This is why, despite the disappointments, she reminded the union reps that there is work waiting for them and the work over the coming days is very important.

The president ended by wishing everyone good debates!

4. CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

4.1 Amendments of the Constitution and Bylaws: Chapter XV – Miscellaneous Provisions

Presented by: Ms. Marie-Claude Ouellet, Political Officer.

Reference document: A17-CE-I-D2 "Amendments of the Constitution and Bylaws"

Ms. Marie-Claude Ouellet stated that in order to allow the affiliated unions not covered by Bill 10 and who will be hence grouped under the *FIQ / Secteur privé* (FIQP) to not meet the criteria for disaffiliation set out in the Constitution and Bylaws of the Federation, the members of the Executive Committee of the FIQ are recommending that the following article be added to Chapter XV – MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS, after Article 3 – TRANSITIONAL MEASURE:

Article 4 – TRANSITIONAL MEASURE REGARDING THE DISAFFILIATION PROCEDURE which states that:

"In the context of the motion adopted at the 10th Convention of the Federation covering the creation of a new labour organization in health and despite the provisions of Article 4 – DISAFFILIATION PROCEDURE in Chapter III ELIGIBILITY – DISAFFILIATION – REMOVAL FROM THE ROLL, the Federal Council may decide to suspend the application of this article.

The suspension of this article only covers the unions under FIQP. At that time, the delegates at the Federal Council must also decide on the conditions applicable instead of those stipulated in Article 4."

Motion **A17-CE-I-04** (Ouellet-Laurent) was tabled.

A 10-minute plenary session began.

A 10 minute deliberative assembly was held and then the chairperson called the vote.

Question of privilege:

- Mr. Stéphane Gagnon, Co-President of the transitional executive committee of the *Syndicat interprofessionnel de Lanaudière*, reminded the delegation that a petition, started by the Regional Action and Consensus-Building Table of Lanaudière, is demanding better management of the care and services needed by the elderly or those with loss of autonomy from the Ministry of Health and Social Services (MSSS).

In support of this approach, Mr. Gagnon challenged the delegates to sign the two post cards “*Respectons nos personnes âgées. Exigeons des soins de qualité*” that were handed out this morning. They can be put in the box at the back of the meeting room or given to him at the next meeting, so that they can be sent to the MSSS.

5. DIRECT EQUALIZATION: CRITERIA TO BETTER MEET THE NEEDS

Presented by: Mr. Roberto Bomba, Political Officer, accompanied by Ms. Michelle Poirier, Coordinator, and Mr. Jean Cartier, Union Consultant.

Reference document: A17-CE-I-D3 “Direct Equalization: Criteria to better meet the needs”.

Mr. Roberto Bomba reminded the delegation that after the tabling of Bill 10, a Bill 10 Strategic Coordination Committee and four focus groups were set up by the Executive Committee of the FIQ with the objective of seeing to the management of the transformation of the health network resulting from the application of Bill 10. In addition to establishing all the necessary links for an efficient and effective transition, the focus group on the ties with the affiliated unions and financial management was responsible to properly manage the financial transition and the governance of the FIQ and its affiliated unions.

At the Special Federal Council in January 2015 the delegates adopted the following recommendation and gave the following mandate to the FIQ:

“To maintain the equalization system while reviewing the terms of direct equalization in order to adapt it to the new reality of the affiliated unions after the reconfiguration of the network from the application of Bill 10.”

Moreover, at this same meeting, the delegation was clear about not touching the indirect equalization, which allows for the payment of union representatives’ travel expenses and expense allowances for their participation at decision-making meetings and in training sessions given by the Federation.

It was at the Federal Council of March 2016 that the focus group presented its first reflections on direct equalization. In fact, based on the current guidelines, the majority of the unions would receive amounts and, this despite the significant number of members in several of the new unions. The funds allotted to direct equalization would increase about 50% and the percentage of the equalization on the total budget of the FIQ also.

Besides this finding, it must be asked if direct equalization really achieves its objective of financially compensating the inequalities between the unions. It is the opinion of the Executive Committee and the focus group that direct equalization should be paid to a minority of unions in order to really compensate the inequalities.

Before presenting the proposed changes, Mr. Bomba wanted to specify that it is important to fully understand what equalization is at the FIQ. In fact, equalization is a form of solidarity among the members and affiliated unions allowing the union representatives from the different regions to have the chance to be involved in the organization, participate at the meetings and training sessions. More specifically, equalization is a redistribution of money that takes into account the size of the union and the dispersal of its members over the territory. It aims to financially compensate the inequalities between the unions so that each one, whatever their size, can have an active union life.

Mr. Jean Cartier continued the presentation by sharing the focus group's reflection on the proposed changes concerning direct equalization. Two criteria were looked at again, the amounts of money allotted to the unions representing a small number of members and those dispersed remotely.

Therefore, with the arrival of new unions following the creation of the CISSSs and CIUSSSs, the number of small unions will significantly decrease. However, it is still pertinent to maintain the right to equalization and even to increase the amounts allotted for the remaining unions. As to the distance between the head office and the different sites of the institution, the latter is used only for the regional unions. Several factors were taken into account in order to adapt the rules related to this criterion to take into consideration this situation. However, given that there has been no validation done by those in charge at the Federation, the focus group has not been able to present a portrait of the unions that will be eligible for direct equalization for the remote sites. This work will be done following the counting of the votes scheduled for the middle of April.

Ms. Michelle Poirier concluded by giving some precisions on the procedure for setting up the new ways of doing things for equalization, in line with the criteria applicable for the 1st payment for 2017, scheduled for June 2017, for the new certifications that will be issued by the Administrative Labour Tribunal (TAT) by April 21.

6. OHS NETWORK

Ms. Linda Lapointe reminded the delegation that a recommendation was adopted at the 2014 Convention to conduct a pilot project on the holding of two editions of the Network of OHS Union Representatives, in the fall of 2015 and 2016, until the next Convention scheduled for 2017. The objective of this project was to evaluate the possibility of giving a permanent status to the Network of OHS Union Representatives at the 2017 Convention.

So, considering the postponement of the June 2017 Convention to November 2017 and the interest shown by the delegates at last December's meeting for holding an OHS Network in 2017, Ms. Lapointe tabled motion **A17-CE-I-13** (Lapointe-Bomba).

A 15-minute plenary session began.

Ms. Lapointe concluded by pointing out that the OHS Sector will make a report on the two meetings held in 2015 and 2016. Moreover, they will start a reflection on the frequency and the formula that will be applied to the Network of OHS Union Representatives and will evaluate the pertinence of giving the Network a permanent nature. The Sector will share the results of this reflection with the delegation at the next Convention.
