

Bill 30: decision rendered

The Superior Court decision represents a victory for all union organizations affected by Bill 30, which was an attack on their rights. Indeed, on November 30, the Court declared unconstitutional this law which forced the merger of union certifications in the health and social services network, and modified the system of negotiations by decentralizing 26 matters to the local level. The Court suspends coming into effect of the invalidity ruling and grants an eighteen-month delay to Quebec the government to take the necessary measures to comply with the decision, a decision which the FIQ greets with satisfaction. The Federation will analyze all the spin-offs of this decision and await the government's reaction to announced before the end of the month.

Two years under the Decree



Postponement of the report of the Castonguay task force to February

The report of the task force on the funding of the Quebec health-care system, initially scheduled for December 20, was postponed to February 2008. The three members of the task force asked for an extension since they were not able to reach a consensus on the central recommendations.

Bouchard-Taylor Commission

On Wednesday, December 12, the FIQ will present a brief entitled "Reasonable accommodations: the importance of going beyond perceptions" before the Commission de consultation sur les pratiques d'accommodements reliées aux différences culturelles. The position of the Federation is based on the results of a questionnaire on the place of religion in the public space, drawn up jointly with the Commission des droits de la personne et des droits de la jeunesse. The response rate to this questionnaire, distributed to 2,000 care professionals, was 25%: a demonstration of members' interest for this question.
