From January 30 to February 13, in all regions of Québec, members of the Secrétariat intersyndical des services publics (SISP) massively distributed flyers designed to promote a public, accessible and quality health system.

SLAPP: presentation of an opinion by the SISP

Strategic lawsuits against public participation, commonly known as SLAPPs are a real threat to democracy since they create a imbalance. To highlight the urgency of government action on this issue, the SISP sent an opinion on February 1 to the Quebec commission on SLAPPs, the *Commission des institutions sur les poursuites stratégiques contre la mobilisation publique*. The government must intervene to protect freedom of opinion and expression, the right of petition and access to justice.
