3rd anniversary of the Chaoulli judgment

To mark the 3rd anniversary of the judgment rendered by the Supreme Court of Canada in the Chaoulli case, Coalition Solidarité Santé is organizing a demonstration in Montreal. It must be remembered that this historic judgment now allows contracting of private insurance to pay for medical care administered by the private sector. This was the first breach, opening the door to privatization of the Quebec health-care network. This June 9, people from the Montreal region and everywhere else are therefore invited to demonstrate in support of the public, free and universal health-care system.
