

Bill C-484: the battle isn't won yet

Despite the ambiguity left by the federal government regarding Bill C-484, the battle isn't won yet. Even though the Conservative government has announced its intention to table a new bill, this doesn't dispose of private member's bill C-484. This bill is therefore continuing its legislative path. Furthermore, if a new Parliament is elected, Conservative MP Ken Epp has already announced that this bill would be tabled again.



Thus, it is essential to maintain our actions to ensure that this bill, opening the door to re-criminalization of abortion, is not adopted. The coalition against the adoption of the bill, which includes the FIQ, is pursuing its action plan. In addition to the national demonstration to be held this September 28, a postcard has been produced. You can obtain it from your local team. This postcard is intended for your federal Member of Parliament. If a federal election is called, the signed cards will be distributed to the different candidates. Your participation is essential to prevent women's rights from being set back twenty years.
