Demonstration at Santa Cabrini Hospital

The nursing and cardio-respiratory professionals at Santa Cabrini Hospital demonstrated in front of their institution to denounce the newest action taken by their employer. Contrary to the majority of health institutions, recourse to overtime was practically inexistent at this hospital. The new position of the employer is to no longer offer overtime to nursing professionals who have offered availability to support their colleagues even if they were on vacation or statutory holidays. This action significantly reduces the number of volunteers wanting to work overtime which, by this very fact, causes the employer to impose the overtime: a real setback for the health professionals.
