During the night Monday, the care professionals, members of the FIQ, set up in front of the National Assembly in order to demand of the government a negotiated settlement before the summer. They intend to stay in place 24 out of 24 hours until the end of the Parliamentary session scheduled for this Friday, in order to be heard.

The message from the care professionals is clear: the government may have decided to abandon the patients, but the FIQ will not do the same. The improvement of the working conditions for the nursing and cardio-respiratory personnel is crucial to being able to offer quality care to the population.
