

## The mediator tables his report

On July 13, the mediator, mandated last May to achieve progress on the difficult negotiations between the government and the FIQ, deposited his report. The FIQ was not surprised to learn that this report only relates the dates of the nine mediation meetings held in the past two months and the nature of the offers deposited by the two parties concerned. The mediator does not propose any solution or any analysis of the negotiating situation, because it seems that the FIQ and the government are still a long way from an agreement. Thus, the action and mobilization plan will continue until the fall, because the FIQ will take the necessary time to reach a satisfactory settlement for its members.
