Taking advantage of their presence in the region, on the occasion of the groundbreaking for the future *Hôpital de Baie-Saint-Paul*, representatives of the Fédération interprofessionnelle de la santé du Québec -FIQ, more specifically the Syndicat des professionnelles en soins de Québec (SPSQ), met with Premier Philippe Couillard and the Minister of Health and Social Services, Gaétan Barrette. This meeting was the opportunity to discuss the negotiations currently under way and to raise the thorny issue of Bill 10 and its impacts on health institutions. "A new hospital is good news, but if the budget doesn't allow adequate services to patients and there aren't enough staff to ensure the quality, safety and continuity of care, this can't work," argued Pierre-Olivier Bradet, President of the SPSQ local team at CIUSSS de la Capitale-Nationale (CSSS de Charlevoix).
