Launch of Coopérative de santé du nord de la Petite-Nation

On June 25, the President of the FIQ, Régine Laurent, announced a \$75,000 contribution by the FIQ to the Chénéville neighbourhood clinic project in the Outaouais



region. After Coopérative SABSA in Quebec City, an urban area, the Coopérative de santé du nord de la Petite-Nation neighbourhood clinic will be the second project of this kind in Quebec and the first in a rural community. This project once again concretizes the intention expressed by the FIQ delegates, on the occasion of the FIQ's last Congress, to develop a new care delivery model relying fully on the capabilities and competencies of healthcare professionals. This reflects the FIQ's will to continue improving the accessibility of care by relying on an interdisciplinary approach.
