## Budget cuts: the FIQ is mobilized



On June 29, 2016, dozens of healthcare professionals protested in front of the constituency office of Jean D'Amour, representative from Rivière-du-Loup-Témiscouata and minister in charge of the Bas-Saint-Laurent region, in order to denounce the budget cuts that were recently announced for the CISSS du Bas-Saint-Laurent.

"We ask Minister D'Amour to intervene with his colleague, Minister of Health Gaétan Barrette, in order to stop this undermining of the healthcare network. The budget cuts imposed by the minister will result in beds closing, which will have a major impact on the quality, safety and continuity of the care offered to the population," stated Linda Lapointe, 6<sup>th</sup> Vice-President of the FIQ, as she supported the protestors at Rivière-du-Loup.

# CHUM poll: 76% of healthcare professionals witness situations where care is not provided for patients due to lack of time!

Conducted by the Léger firm from April 27 to May 16, 2016, a poll ordered by the local union of the CHUM in Montréal clearly shows the exhaustion and work overload imposed upon the healthcare professionals of this institution.

"Our patients' safety is in danger," stated Guy Brochu, President of the local FIQ union. "What worries me the most is that we don't have enough time to evaluate our patients. Of course, we can prioritize cases, but when you don't have time to do so, it can become dangerous," he continued. In the urgency of this situation, Minister Gaétan Barrette turns a deaf ear. His answer on 98.5 FM is crystal clear: "The problem doesn't exist and has never existed. It was invented by the unions. There is no need to act because there is nothing to rectify." Bandages that aren't changed, delays in the rounds for medication, no listening during diagnostics: the lack of time has severe consequences on care, according to Mr. Brochu.

"We are headed for disaster," added Nancy Bédard, 4<sup>th</sup> Vice-President of the FIQ.
