### COMPOSITION OF THE RFIQ NETWORKS WOMEN'S, YOUTH, OHS AND OWPP

At the time of its founding, the Federation had a principle aimed at the participation of as many members as possible in decision-making. As a result, its constitution and bylaws set out large decision-making bodies composed of union reps from every work setting (CH, CHSLD, CLSC, EPC, etc.).

When the institutions were merged to create the CSSSs and following the passing of Bills 25 and 30 in 2003, the delegation ensured that the democratic and accessible nature of the organization was maintained. Its constitution and bylaws were adjusted to provide for the representation, as much as possible, of union reps from each of the missions that made up the new CSSSs.

At the 2017 Convention, the delegates acknowledged that the Federation should be able to continue counting on all its union reps. Moreover, they confirmed the relevance of maintaining the composition of the provincial and Federation decision-making bodies – Convention and Federal and Provincial Council – according to the conditions adopted in the FIQ, FIQP and RFIQ Constitutions and Bylaws.

In the same way, the composition of the RFIQ Networks (Women's, Youth, OHS and OWPP), like the composition of the delegation at meetings, must be based on equitable representation from each of the CISSS, CIUSSS, non-merged institutions and the unions that make up the FIQP. The number of sites covered by the unions affiliated to the Federations must also be taken into account. Again, in the interests of fairness, it is important to review the nature of the different networks.

The composition of the Networks also provided for the participation of one union rep from each of the Regional Action and Consensus-Building Tables (TRAC). Considering the TRACs will end in 2021, it is necessary to foresee that this union rep will cease to participate as of the dissolution.

- Whereas the passing of Bill 10 (Act to amend the organization and governance of the health and social services network, notably by abolishing regional agencies), the creation of CISSSs and CIUSSSs and at the same time the creation of the FIQP;
- **Whereas** the current composition of the different Networks is not representative of the number of members by CISSS, CIUSSS, non-merged institution and union affiliated to the FIQP and that it is appropriate to preserve the stability and cohesion of the union and political action of the RFIQ;
- **Whereas** the relevance of ensuring consistency between the participation of union reps in decision-making bodies and participation of union reps in the FIQ Networks (Women's, Youth OHS, OWPP);

#### The Executive Committee recommends:

The following composition of the RFIQ Networks (Women's, Youth, OHS, OWPP), until a future Convention decides otherwise.
